



## ORDER RESCINDING DECLARATION OF LOCAL DISASTER FOR LAVACA COUNTY, TEXAS

WHEREAS, on June 22, 2022, Lavaca County Judge Mark Myers issued a Declaration of Local Disaster for the unincorporated areas of Lavaca County due to the severe drought conditions and the threat of dangerous and fast moving wildfires; and

WHEREAS, on June 27, 2022, the Lavaca County Commissioners Court renewed and extended the Declaration of Local Disaster; and

WHEREAS, due to recent weather conditions, rainfall and a slight temporary cooling weather pattern, the conditions no longer constitute an imminent threat of disaster.

NOW THEREFORE, UNDER THE AUTHORITY OF TEXAS GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 418.108, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

The Declaration of Local Disaster declared by Lavaca County Judge, Mark Myers on June 22, 2022 and renewed and extended by Lavaca County Commissioners Court on June 27, 2022 is hereby **RESCINDED** due to recent weather conditions, rainfall and a slight temporary cooling weather pattern.
